Other carriers might look for ways to deny your coverage or complain that an adequate defense costs too much. Going through a lawsuit or board complaint with a carrier who believes in you and consistently supports the profession is invaluable.



Like sports commentators, the penchant of political pundits to fall back on vacuous clichés is almost unavoidable. We can't seem to help ourselves. I found myself spouting the "politics is a blood sport" tripe recently in an effort to explain and ease the pain of the manner in which chiropractic suffered a legislative loss. Some have bigger political sticks than others, and at times that reality trumps truth, justice, and the American Way. See, I did it again.

Using clichés may make it easier to clarify complex issues or difficult realties. However, for chiropractic the stakes are too high, and the prejudice of ignorance can't be overcome by clichés. Few professions suffer more prejudice than chiropractic, and more significant work must be done. At the end of the day it's a marathon not a sprint. I still can't help myself, I'm a cliché junkie.

The point is chiropractic in California faces many challenges, not the least of which is its image. Twenty-four percent of the populace thinks chiropractic is dangerous. This populace also includes politicians with great power over the profession. The question we should all be focused on answering is, "How do we improve that image?" Two decades ago tennis star Andre Agassi famously pitched a

product using the slogan "Image is everything," and all derided the pitch for its shallowness. In today's world where every move of talentless reality stars is followed by millions, we need look no further than Agassi's slogan to see its power.



# Call for Participants Chiropractic Care Study For Chronic Pain

We are looking for doctors of chiropractic in San Diego or surounding areas interested in participating.

RAND is conducting a study examining the impact of evidence, outcomes, costs, and patient preferences on the choice of



treatment for chronic low back pain and chronic neck pain. This study is funded by the National Center for Complementary and Integrative Health (NCCIH), and its aims are; 1) to understand better ways to assess appropriateness within complementary and alternative medicine (CAM), such as chiropractic care; 2) to determine how the inclusion of patient perspectives and cost impacts measures of appropriateness; and 3) to learn about patient preferences and experiences related to treating back pain and neck pain.

We will conduct our national study in and around these six regions: Dallas, TX; San Diego, CA; Minneapolis, MN; White Plains/Yonkers, NY; Portland OR, and Tampa, FL. We are recruiting clinics for our national study starting now through the end of 2016.

We would love to talk to you if are a licensed chiropractor who



works in a stand-alone (community) chiropractic practice, is in a solo or multi-provider practice, is part of a chiropractic-only or integrative practice, sees a minimum of 25 patients per week and has at least 5 years of experience post-training. We are not able to include: Clinics based in chiropractic schools, hospitals, VA or DoD clinics; Clinics where more than half of the patients are on workers compensation or Personal Injury claims.

Patients and clinics will be paid to participate. Participating clinics would be asked to assist with recruiting patients to the study. Interested patients will answer a few questions and enter their contact information on the study iPad. The research team will contact interested patients, screen them for eligibility, and will guide them in completing the surveys during the three month study period. The research team will also review medical charts of the 20 clinic-recruited patients and charts of additional sample of patients. Charts will be reviewed for data about patient medical history, treatments received, and outcomes. Some of these data will be used to study rates at which providers across the country use manipulation and mobilization to treat chronic back and neck pain and compare those rates with ratings from an Expert Panel.

Participating patients will complete multiple web surveys for three-months. Patients will be asked about their experiences with chronic low back or neck pain (such as the frequency, intensity, and duration of their pain), including outcomes such as ability to do daily activities, experiences with and preferences related to chiropractic care, and experiences with and opinions about costs of chiropractic care.

# SCU Faculty and Clinicians Receive the Clinical Research Award

SCU would like to congratulate Dr. Anupama Kizhakkeveettil, Dr. Kevin Rose, Dr. Gena E. Kadar, and Dr. Eric Hurwitz, on receiving the Clinical Research Award at the 2016 Association of Chiropractic

College Research Agenda Conference for their study, Integrative Acupuncture and Spinal Manipulative Therapy Versus Either Alone for Low Back Pain: A Randomized Controlled Trial. The study received both the Parker and SCU research grants and was conducted at our SCU Health Center. The objective was to determine the feasibility of conducting a large-scale randomized clinical trial examining whether an integrative care model combining acupuncture and spinal manipulative therapy would lead to better outcomes of low back pain management than either therapy alone.

The study involved over 100 participants with both acute and chronic low back pain. Participants were randomized into three groups: acupuncture, spinal manipulative therapy and integrative acupuncture and spinal manipulative therapy and received treatment over the course of 60 days.

The study found that while there was no difference in outcomes between groups, all three of the groups experienced clinically meaningful improvements. This study demonstrated that it is feasible to conduct a RCT to compare the effectiveness of integrative acupuncture and SMT for LBP to either therapy alone. Future studies should include a larger sample to increase the power for detecting clinically meaningful differences between groups.

We are extremely proud of the accomplishment our SCU faculty and Clinicians have achieved.

"It was fun and exciting to treat athletes from all over the world," said Dr. Prusso, team chiropractor for the Oakland Raiders, who also serves as president of the Professional Football Chiropractic Society (PFCS).

"In speaking with many of the athletes, often through interpreters, it became apparent that while some countries don't have staff chiropractors available to treat their teams, the availability of our services were highly valued by the athletes, and they sought our care."

"I wanted to be involved in this iconic event in some capacity, and I'm grateful that I was able to do so as a chiropractor," said Dr. Thornberry, a trackand-field athlete at Xavier Univ., who maintains her practice at Thornberry Running and Sports Therapy in Pleasanton, Calif., while also serving as the assistant track and cross-country coach at Foothill High School in Pleasanton.
